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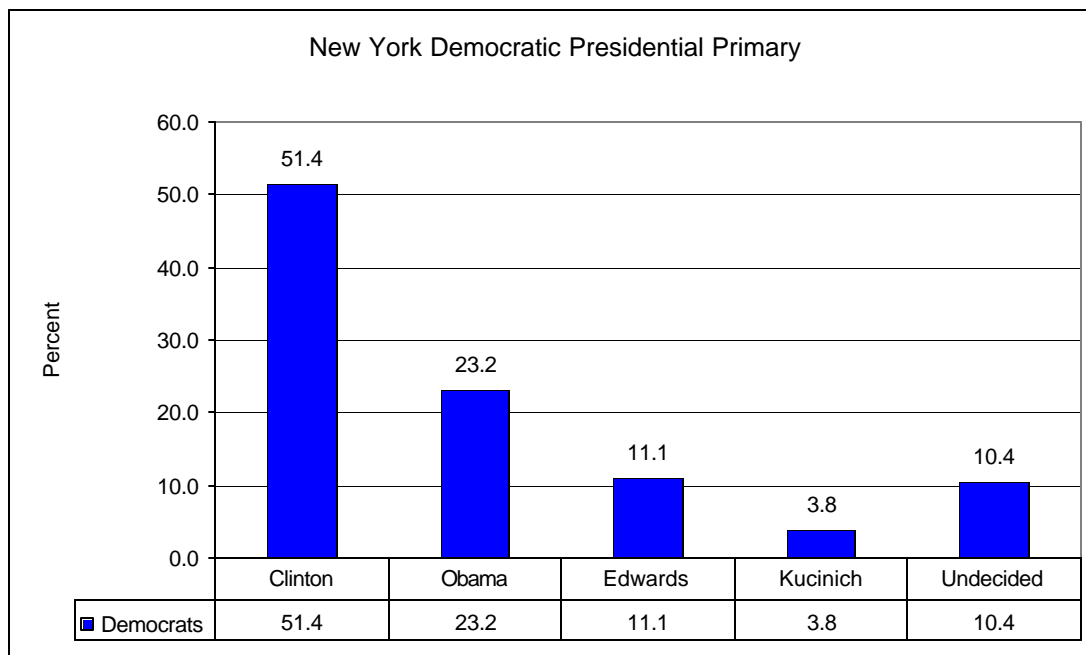

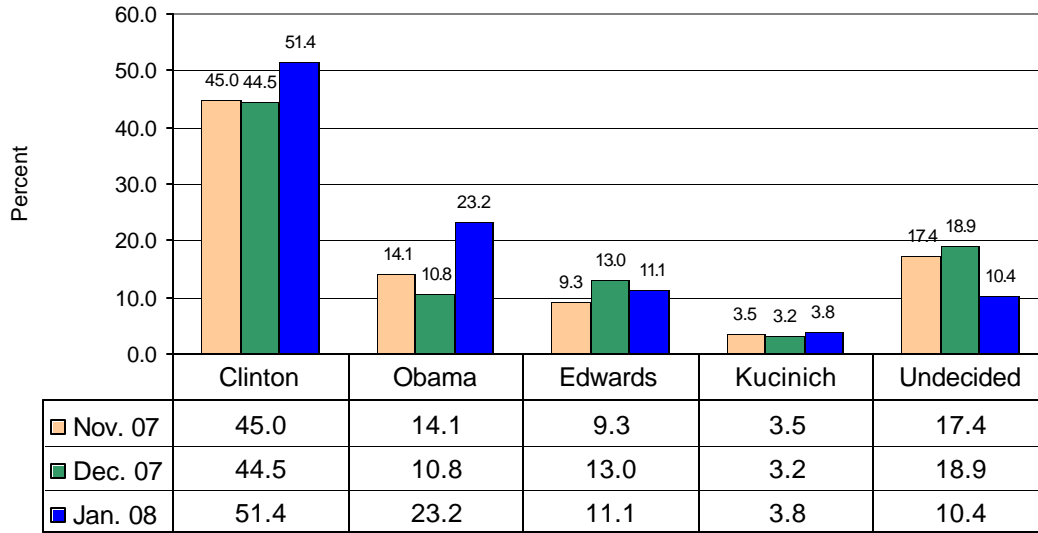

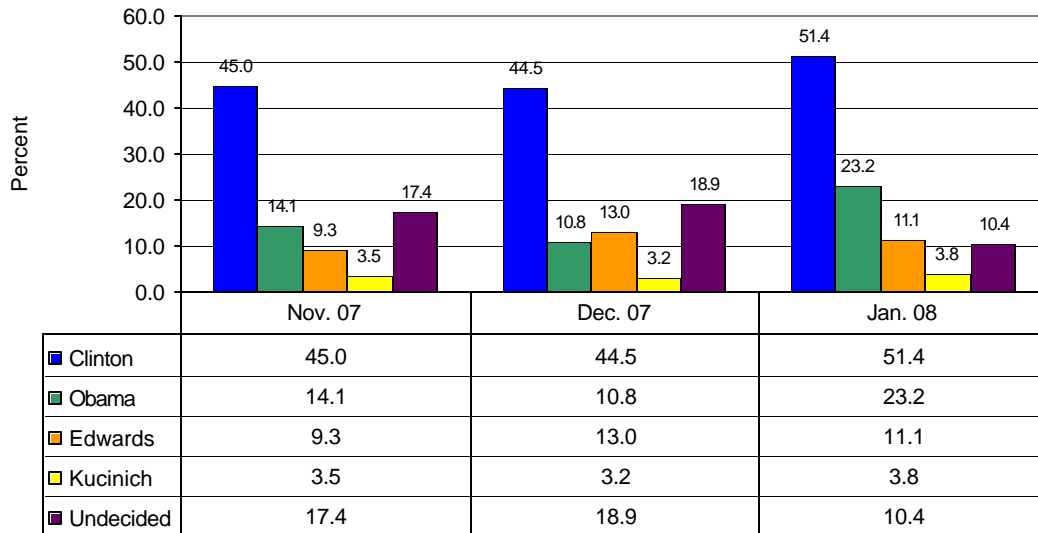
San Diego – A poll released today by Datamar Inc., shows that U.S. Senator from New York, Hillary Clinton has increased her lead to 51.4 %, in the New York Democratic Presidential primary. U.S. Senator from Illinois, Barack Obama, is still in second place with 23.2%, and former U.S. Senator from North Carolina, John Edwards at 11.1%, is third. Findings are based on a January 20 - 22, 2008 survey of New York voters.

Methodology: Findings are based on a January 20 - 22, 2008 survey of New York voters. The survey was conducted using an automated telephone dialer and the voice of a professional announcer. The targeted-registration-based-sampling (TRBS)* selection criteria were based on election cycles and other voter factors in New York. Datamar proprietary algorithms were used to generate random samples from the target group for calling.

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The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 3.9 percent at the 95 percent confidence level.

Where necessary, responses were weighted according to age, gender, and political party.
