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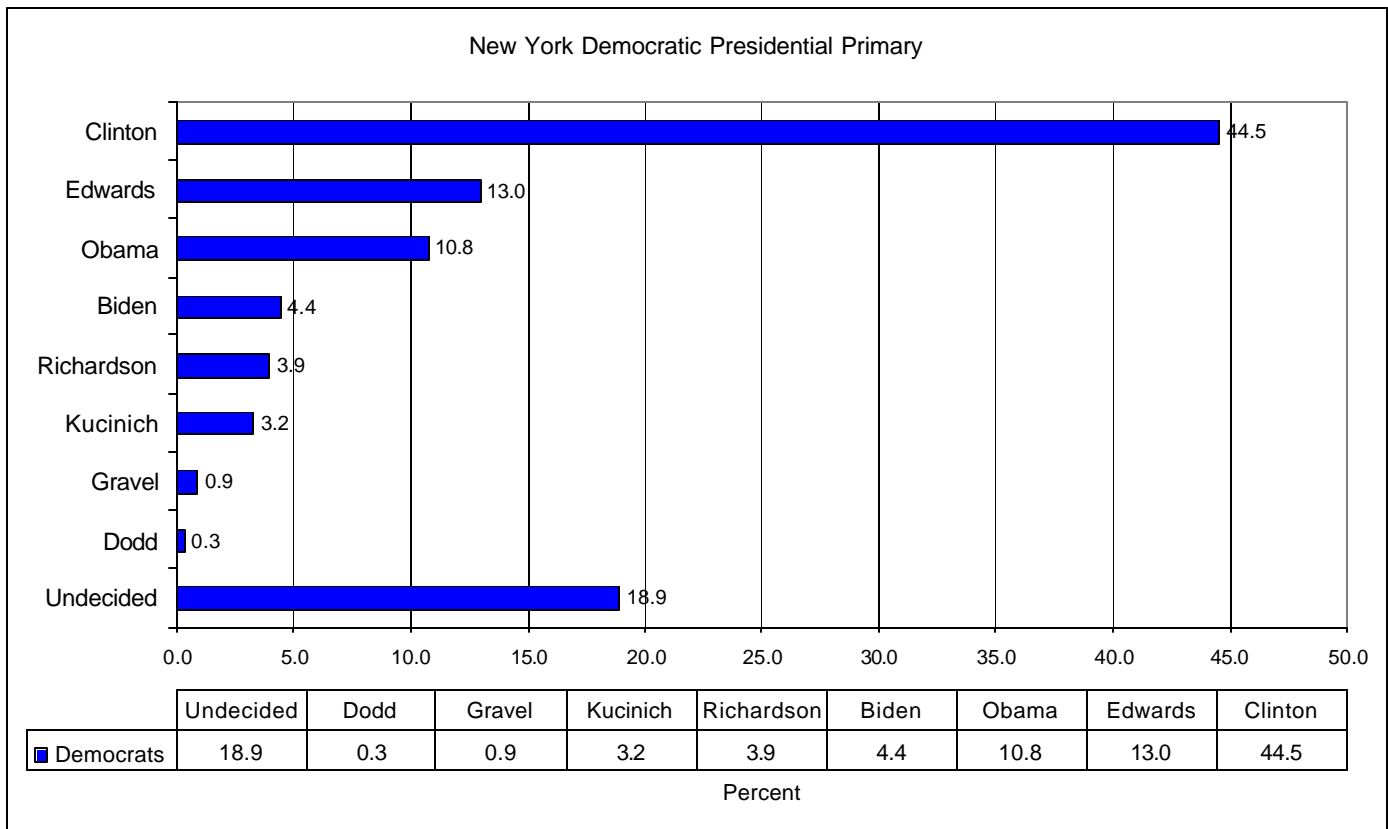

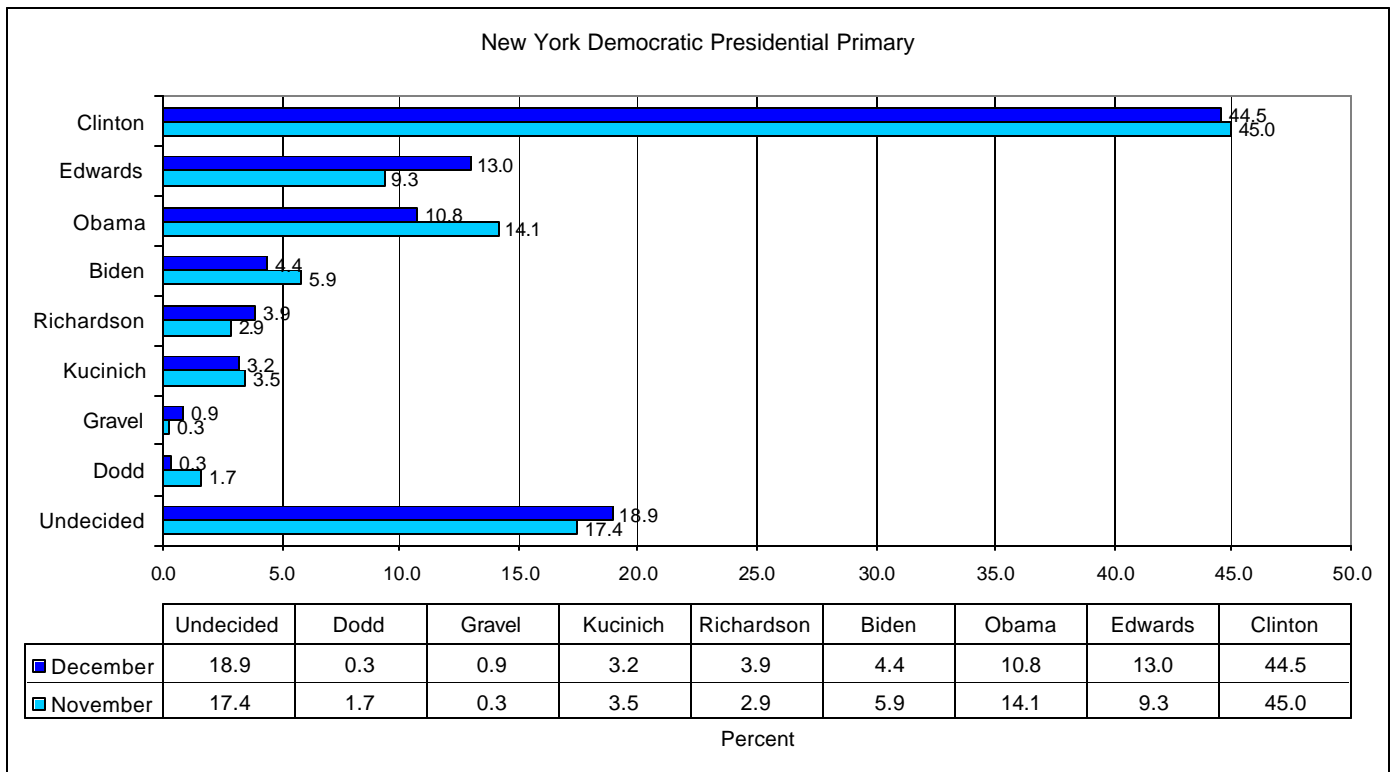

San Diego – A poll released today by Datamar Inc., shows that U.S. Senator from New York, Hillary Clinton, 44.5%, is the leader in the New York presidential primary. Former U.S. Senator from North Carolina, John Edwards, is a distant second with 13%, and U.S. Senator from Illinois, Barack Obama, 10.8%, is in third place. Findings are based on a December 2 - 8, 2007 survey of New York voters.

Methodology: Findings are based on December 2 - 8, 2007 survey of New York voters. The survey was conducted using an automated telephone dialer using the voice of a professional announcer, and online, where respondents used a login to access the survey.

The targeted-registration-based-sampling (TRBS)* selection criteria were based on election cycles and other voter factors in New York. Datamar proprietary algorithms were used to generate random samples from the target group for calling.

Where necessary, responses were weighted according to age, gender, and political party.

The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 4.0 percent at the 95 percent confidence level.
